

POLITECNICO DI MILANO

Politecnico di Milano is one of the most renowned universities in the world, ranked **13th in the World, 7th in Europe, and 1st in Italy by the QS World University Ranking** (Subject - Engineering & Technology, 2023). Founded in 1863, with over 48.000 students, it is the largest school of Architecture, Design and Engineering in Italy, with 2 main Campuses located in Milan, the heart of fashion and design industries, 5 Campuses located within the Lombardy region, one of the most developed and innovative industrial areas in Europe, and one Campus in Xi'an, China.

Thanks to a strong internationalization policy, several of its Master level study programmes are taught entirely in English, attracting an everincreasing number of talented international students, now forming a diverse community from over 100 countries.

Teaching is closely related to research, a key commitment that enables to achieve results that reach high international standards, while creating connections with the business world.

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THE SCHOOL OF MANAGEMENT

The Politecnico di Milano School of Management (SoM) groups together the Department of Management, Economics and Industrial Engineering (DIG), and the Polimi Graduate School of Management (GSOM), providing all research and education activities in the field of Management. With around 6,000 students enrolled at all levels, of which over 25% are international, it currently offers more than 50 programmes - ranging from BSc and MSc degrees, to MBA, EMBA, Open and customized Executive Programmes to Specializing Masters - taught on the most modern of the Politecnico Campuses in Milan.

Its Mission is to contribute to the collective good through a critical understanding of the opportunities offered by innovation. This mission is accomplished by creating and sharing knowledge through high-quality education, high-quality research, and engagement with the community.

Research plays a key role in creating new knowledge, enhancing the level of teaching, establishing effective relationships with the corporate world, with policymakers and society. Students can benefit from a vibrant and dynamic community, that offers many networking and personal development opportunities.

The School of Management is currently accredited by AACSB, EQUIS, AMBA, EOCCS and ASFOR. Several of its programmes are currently included in the Financial Times ranking system.



THE MANAGEMENT ENGINEERING CURRICULUM

The Department of Management, Economics and Industrial Engineering (DIG) carries out research and teaching in several main areas: Economics, Business Management and Organisation; Political, Industrial and Regional Economics; Production Systems, Industrial Plants and Logistics.

Since being established, research at DIG has been defined by its commitment to cutting-edge topics within the international scientific debate and its awareness of the demands of industry and services.

This is reflected in its curriculum that for the MSc in Management Engineering develops in the following fourteen Majors, offering over 130 courses a year, for the most part open to exchange students:

BEING AN EXCHANGE STUDENT AT SOM

The School of Management has built a worldwide network of international partnerships that allows for a vast array of exchange and double degree opportunities for incoming students. Every year it welcomes around 350 Bachelor and Master of Science exchange students, while an equal number of Politecnico Management Engineering students enrol in its prestigious international partners' programmes.

Exchange students are welcome to enrol in most courses, both at the Bachelor and at the Master of Science level, therefore attending classes and working closely on projects with degree seeking students. While Bachelor level courses are offered in Italian, all MSc level courses are taught in English. Upon approval from their home institution, BSc exchange students may enrol in MSc level courses.

Exchange students will be able to choose every year from over 130 courses entirely taught in English within the Management Engineering curriculum, while having the possibility of also enrolling in a limited number of classes offered by other Departments within the School of Engineering. Exchange students will not be required to select one of the MSc programme Majors, therefore benefiting from ample freedom in building their schedule, not bound by their course year.



ACADEMIC CALENDAR



At Politecnico di Milano courses run by semester (September to December, with examinations in January-February; February to June, with examinations in June-July), with no summer sessions. A full semester course load is 30 ECTS credits. In order to earn credits, students will undergo final examinations. Exchange students must submit their Study Plan online, to enrol for classes and take exams. The Study Plan must be based on their Learning Agreement.



1° SEMESTER September to December (Exams: January & February)



2° SEMESTER February to June (Exams: June & July)



Students will receive guidance for this and many other important matters (immigration, access to online services, library services, health & wellbeing tips and services, etc.) from the International Mobility Unit during the Welcome Week, and throughout the semester. Additional support will come from the Buddy Project, that provides students with peer support, helping them adapt to a new academic environment, and to a culture and traditions that may initially feel distant from their own. While enrolled, exchange students will also enjoy taking part in student clubs and organizations, sports teams and tournaments, and many excursions and activities organized by student associations (i.e. ESN).

Those who wish to enrol at SoM as exchange students, must be sure to check with their home university that there is an agreement in place with Politecnico di Milano and that the agreement pertains the Department of Management, Economics and Industrial Engineering. Politecnico di Milano does not accept independent incoming exchange students.

HOW TO REACH OUR CAMPUS:

FROM CENTRALE FS METRO STATION

Take the M2 green underground (towards Assago Milanofiori Forum/Abbiategrasso), get off at Garibaldi Station (second stop), take the underground urban train (passante) S1 line (towards Saronno) or S2 line (towards Meda-Mariano Comense) or S13 line (towards Bovisa) and get off at the Milano Bovisa Politecnico station (second stop).

Estimated journey time: 15 minutes.

FROM CADORNA FNM METRO STOP

Take the S3 line (towards Saronno) or S4 line (towards Camnago Lentate) or R22 line (towards Varese) and get off at the Milano Bovisa Politecnico station (second stop).


Estimated journey time: 8 minutes.

FROM DUOMO METRO STOP

Take the M1 red underground (towards Rho Fiera-Bisceglie), get off at Cadorna station (third stop), go into the train station and take the S3 line (towards Saronno) or S4 line (towards Camnago Lentate) or R22 line (towards Varese) and get off at the Milano Bovisa Politecnico station (second stop).

Estimated journey time: 15 minutes.

Alternative	route:	Take	the	M1	red
underground	(towa	rds S	Sesto	FS),	get



off at Porta Venezia Station (third stop), take the underground urban train (passante) S1 line (towards Saronno) or S2 line (towards Meda-Mariano Comense) or S13 line (towards Bovisa) and get off at the Milano Bovisa Politecnico station (fourth stop).

Estimated journey time: 25 minutes.
